A MESSAGE FROM DAN LEVITT, CEO

ACCREDITATION CANADA COMPLETES SURVEY AT KINVILLAGE

OCTOBER 18, 2023

KinVillage has completed a three-day on-site survey conducted by Accreditation Canada, an ongoing process of assessing health care and social services organizations against rigorous standards of excellence to identify what is being done well and what needs to be improved. From October 16, 2023 to October 18, 2023 surveyors from Accreditation Canada visited KinVillage to evaluate the organization on how well it performs against national standards of excellence for quality and safety.

KinVillage was surveyed against Accreditation Canada's standards which include Required Organizational Practices (ROPs), critical quality practices that ensure safe, quality patient care. ROPs are categorized across six safety areas: safety culture, communication, medication use, infection control, work-life/workforce and risk assessment.

In addition, KinVillage was assessed based on the standards of excellence comprised of criteria that ensure service excellence in medication management, infection prevention and control, leadership and governance, and more.

"Despite the challenges faced by our direct care and support services staff as a result of the pandemic, they continued to provide high quality, compassionate care to the older adults we serve," said Dan Levitt, CEO. "The Accreditation process examines the level to which standards are implemented from the governance level to direct care lovingly provided to older persons as KinVillage advances forward with a continuous quality improvement and person-centred agenda.

An award decision is expected from Accreditation Canada in the near future and once received the full report will be available on the KinVillage website.

A new FREE Program coming to the Community Centre brought to you courtesy of David Lemon

David Lemon is enthusiastic about films, especially those of the 1930s to the 1960s, and "classical" music. He likes sharing the films and music he enjoys with friends. As a boy he'd say "Come and listen to this!" to his parents when he was excited about a new record. These programs are informal and conversational. David will give a brief introduction to each film or piece of music, and afterwards the group can chat about what they have seen and heard. November is OSTEOPOROSIS Awareness Month



WHAT IS OSTEOPOROSIS?

Osteoporosis is a disease characterized by low bone mass and deterioration of bone tissue, which can lead to increased risk of fractures. Known as the “**silent thief**”, bone deterioration can occur over a number of years without presenting any symptoms. Unfortunately, if detected at the time of a break, the disease is already fairly advanced. The most common fractures associated with osteoporosis are in the hip, spine, wrist, and shoulder. Today, no single cause for osteoporosis has been identified.

THE PREVALENCE OF OSTEOPOROSIS

While Osteoporosis can affect people at almost any age, it is most common among Canadians 50 years of age or older. 2.3 million Canadians are living with osteoporosis.

At least 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will break a bone due to osteoporosis in their lifetime.

Fragility fractures represent 80% of all fractures in menopausal women over the age of 50.

Fractures from osteoporosis are more common than heart attack, stroke and breast cancer combined.

THE IMPACT OF OSTEOPOROSIS

People living with osteoporosis face a reduced quality of life, lowered self-esteem, reduction or loss of mobility, disfigurement, a lack of independence and in some cases, death – 22% of women and 33% of men who suffer a hip fracture will die within the following year.

SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

Osteoporosis is a disease that takes years to develop without any warning symptoms. Bone mineral is gradually lost, making the bones weaker and more prone to fracturing or breaking.

Because the first warning sign of osteoporosis is frequently a fracture, it is often called “the silent thief” as it literally steals bone mass without giving any indication of doing so whatsoever, until a fracture occurs.

SPINE FRACTURES, HEIGHT LOSS AND OSTEOPOROSIS

All men and women over 50 should have their height measured annually to assess for possible spine fracture. Many spine fractures are asymptomatic (i.e. painless) and many people are not even aware that they have had one. One important clue that a spine fracture may be present is the loss of height.

Everyone loses a bit of height with age. So, how much is too much? When height is measured on an on-going basis by a healthcare professional, a loss of 2 cm (3/4 inch) or more is significant and could be a warning sign that a spine fracture is present.

TREATMENT

Exercise, nutrition and pharmacotherapy are key elements of the management strategy for fracture prevention and should be individualized.

Functional and balance training in adults older than 50 years can reduce the number of falls.
