

MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

The first weekend was a three-day celebration of fun in the sun, with the Tsawwassen Sun Festival. At the Rotary Club sponsored parade, the Community Spirit Award was bestowed upon KinVillage. Kudos to everyone involved in representing programs and services that support older persons in Tsawwassen so well. Let's keep that community spirit alive and thriving all year long!

By mid-month, the long-awaited ground breaking ceremony was held at the new North Court construction site, an important step in the KinVillage master plan transforming housing, programs and services to meet the changing needs of an ageing community.



The Day Program provides a variety of therapeutic and supportive services to older persons with the aim of improving their health and wellbeing so they can remain in their homes as long as possible.

At month's end, Autumn is in the air and plans are underway for September including the September 16th 7 Over 70 Awards and Gala being held at Tsawwassen Springs to celebrate the remarkable achievements of older adults - a true testament that greatness knows no age limit!

Also, on September 12th, KinVillage Association will hold its Annual General Meeting (AGM) to reflect on the year that has passed and look ahead to the next year. KinVillage is a unique community with a continuum of outreach community-based services, a Community Centre, on-site day programs and a variety of housing, assisted living, and long term care. Sharing this story with the public has become a top priority told through a new website and a concerted effort to promote the way KinVillage has impacted the lives of older adults. This narrative will be shared in an Annual Review publication reporting on the state of KinVillage as we build for tomorrow.

As you may be aware, KinVillage is a non-profit organization governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. The members of the Board focus on the high-level strategy, oversight, and accountability of the organization. This contrasts with leaders and employees who oversee the day-to-day operations including receiving feedback from you on how programs and services can be improved to better meet the needs of older persons. The goal of the Board and Leadership Team is to create a future where older adults will live life to the fullest at every age and stage of life, wherever they are on their ageing journey. It's a future where growing older fuels hope, with the start of a new beginning.

We are grateful to the KinVillage community whose support has begun, and will continue to be, integral to a successful future as we together face the challenges of our times.

KinVillage will continue to tirelessly push forward, to expand the impact on the lives of older persons. Day by day, we are rethinking the future of ageing both on the Tsawwassen campus and beyond.

CHANGES AT KINVILLAGE

We proudly marked the official ground breaking of our 152 unit seniors' affordable rental housing complex on 54A Street! With a wide range of rent options, including income-based, market rates, and deep-subsidy rates for those of income assistance, we are creating an inclusive environment for everyone.

This building will also include space for an Enhanced Day Program for Older Adults on the main floor. This will allow seniors to stay at home longer, promotes an active lifestyle and provides caregivers with much needed support.





The West Court family room renovation has begun!! New Vision Projects is donating their expertise and trades people for this project. KinVillage also received a generous donation of \$10,000 from a family member to help. The renovation involves closing the 2 existing doorways and creating a new one, new lighting, new paint, new cupboards for the kitchenette and new furniture. We anticipate the project will take approximately 2-4 weeks. During this time there will be no access to the courtyard. Residents and families can access the courtyard before 9:00am and after 2:30pm through the Day Program.

Accreditation Canada – Quality Matters

KinVillage has been accredited for many years by Accreditation Canada (AC), the last accreditation occurring in 2019. Every few years we go through the process of assessing services provided against national standards of excellence, and welcoming AC surveyors. This October KinVillage will be visited by AC surveyors. The three areas that are of focus for accreditation are: West Court Long-term Care, South Court Assisted Living and the Day Program for Older Adults.

Accreditation in health care is an ongoing process of assessing how an organization is performing in relation to national standards of excellence, to identify what is being done well and what areas can be improved in order to offer the best possible care, quality of life and services. Needless to say, we at KinVillage are continuously assessing and reviewing what we are doing, identifying areas that we can improve on, and setting priorities for the upcoming year. We do this through feedback from residents, clients, tenants, families, staff, the community as well as from results of satisfaction surveys and latest best practices in care of older adults.

Post COVID-19 Pandemic, KinVillage has shifted its focus from managing the risk of COVID entering its homes to re-connecting with its vision of building a caring community where every person feels they matter and to support older adults to live their lives fully. A number of projects have been underway including the ground-breaking of the North Court Redevelopment project, enhancing the dining experience for residents, re-opening the Day Program for Older Adults to in-person participation, welcoming back the many volunteers to as the Community Center was reopened offering a wide variety of programs and events, renovating our buildings including applying fresh paint and renovating the family room in West Court, and upgrading both the telephone system and internet connectivity.

In addition to the many projects occurring, we have engaged with residents, clients, tenants, and staff during the day-to-day life of people living and working at KinVillage. We have heard from you including the need to get back to normal with activities for the residents, to bring back arts and music, to cleaning up the gardens, to family functions such as summer barbecues and ice cream socials.

KinVillage has been working hard and is committed to meet the national standards set by Accreditation Canada to provide safe, high-quality care. The accreditation process helps us to validate, identify and celebrate our strengths in addition to identify areas where we can make improvements to achieve safe, high-quality care and services.
