F17FT1 Visit to West Coast Seeds Headquarters in Ladner

On this visit, you will have the opportunity to participate in a private, ninety-minute tour of the West Coast Seeds primary facility in Ladner. You will learn the history of West Coast Seeds, started as a small, local enterprise and now a major producer of organic, non-GMO vegetable and flower seeds to all of North America and beyond. You will follow the process of growing and selecting seeds for preference and quality control. You will also visit the experimental fields to see approaches to fall and winter plantings. During the visit, there will be ample opportunity for questions. Later, a personal visit to the West Coast Seeds store in downtown Ladner might round out your experience.

F17FT2 Tour of Gulf of Georgia Cannery and Visit to Steveston

Located in the historic fishing village of Steveston, the Gulf of Georgia Cannery, built in 1894, was one of the biggest of its time and known as the “Monster Cannery” among locals. Today, the Cannery is the last among more than 15 canneries that once occupied cannery row on the Steveston waterfront. As a national historic site, it now showcases the history of Canada’s West Coast fishing industry. Our private, behind the scenes tour will include the canning line of the ‘30s to ‘60s era, the herring reduction plant that didn’t close until 1979, and a peek at the collections area.

**S17SP3: Following the Ancestors: Inuit Testimony and the Franklin Wrecks
Presented by David Woodman**

(Historian, Explorer and Author)

The discovery of Sir John Franklin’s two ships from the tragic Franklin Expedition of 1845, missing for 170 years in the Arctic, was the result of modern technology combined with the oral traditions of the Inuit.

Dave Woodman, author of *Unravelling the Franklin Mystery: Inuit Testimony*, will trace the Inuit traditions that narrowed the search, and offer insight as to what may be found as the wrecks are analyzed in the coming years.

Dave Woodman has been fortunate enough to lead or participate in ten expeditions to the Arctic to investigate wreck locations and to engender new interest in the Franklin expedition worldwide. He was awarded the Erebus Medal for his contribution to the discovery of the HMS Erebus in 2014.
