# Message from the CEO Accreditation Canada – Quality Matters

KinVillage has completed a three-day onsite survey conducted by Accreditation Canada.

Accreditation is an ongoing process of assessing health care and social services organizations against rigorous standards of excellence. From October 16, 2023 to October 18, 2023 surveyors from Accreditation Canada visited KinVillage to evaluate the organization on how well it performs against national standards of excellence for quality and safety.



Accreditation Canada's standards which include Required Organizational Practices (ROPs), critical quality practices that ensure safe, quality patient care. ROPs are categorized across six safety areas: safety culture, communication, medication use, infection control, work-life/workforce and risk assessment.

Despite the challenges faced by our direct care and support services staff as a result of the pandemic, they continued to provide high quality, compassionate care to the older adults we serve," said Dan Levitt, CEO. "The Accreditation process examines the level to which standards are implemented from the governance level to direct care lovingly provided to older persons as KinVillage advances forward with a continuous quality improvement and person-centred agenda.

An award decision is expected from Accreditation Canada in the near future and once received the full report will be available on the KinVillage website.




We look forward to start preparing for the upcoming Christmas Season!











# **VACCINATION INFORMATION**

## Vaccination - Protect yourself. Protect your community.

As we are approaching fall and winter, respiratory viruses such as influenza and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) typically increases. Although the seasonality of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, has not been established yet, to help reduce the impact of COVID-19 on the health system while other viruses are circulating and to help protect yourself, your community and the people you care for, *vaccination against Influenza and COVID-19 is highly recommended*.

### Why Get Vaccinated?

**To protect yourself** - Getting vaccinated against influenza and COVID-19 greatly reduces the risk of you catching the virus and if you do catch the virus, your risk of serious harm is significantly lowered.

**To Protect Others** – Getting vaccinated means it is harder for the COVID-19 and Influenza virus to move between people, reducing transmission within your community and within the care home when you visit your loved one.

**To Create a Safer Workplace** – Vaccination is a key part of infection prevention that protects your colleagues and your residents and clients.

- Annual vaccination against influenza remains the cornerstone of efforts to control influenza transmission.
- Vaccination against COVID-19 not only protects the individual; it minimizes the opportunity for the virus to spread. Additional doses help maintain your level of protection against severe illness from a COVID-19 infection and offers better protection against the latest variants.

# Community Group Raises Funds For Day Program for Older Adults

The South Delta Community Impact Committee (SDCIC) organized its annual Halloween charity event, 'Cheers for Fears,' on October 28th at the KinVillage Community Centre. This Halloween affair rolled out the red carpet and committed to donating 100% of its proceeds towards the redevelopment and expansion of the KinVillage's Enhanced Day Program for Older Adults.

'Cheers for Fears' was conceived by the SDCIC to engage South Delta's early millennials and challenge the stereotypes surrounding senior care. It emphasized the significance of providing direct support to elderly members of the community. Dan Levitt, CEO of KinVillage,



expressed his gratitude for SDCIC's support, stating, "We are immensely thankful for organizations like the South Delta Community Impact Committee, which are backing this much-needed redevelopment project and contributing to the well-being of our current and future residents. In just two years, 'Cheers for Fears' has raised over \$30,000 to fund essential services for older adults.

'Cheers for Fears' transformed the typical fundraising experience, encouraging guests to don spooky costumes while indulging in draft beer, wine, coolers, gourmet canapés by Chef Adrian of Buenos Dias Café, and late-night cheeseburgers generously provided by McDonald's. The event also featured a lively DJ, a 50/50 draw, and costume contests, ensuring guests had a memorable night.
